Accreditation decisions were made for programs at 27 schools by the Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communications (ACEJMC).

ACEJMC accredits 120 schools in the United States and other nations. The Council conducts voluntary reviews for schools with professional journalism and mass communications programs at the undergraduate and master's degree levels.
